Santa Fe, Los Alamos, Taos Colfax, Mora, Rio Arriba, and San Miguel Counties



FUNDING STRATEGIES

- Support dynamic, robust nonprofit ecosystem
- Partner with a broad network of nonprofits addressing various community needs across lifespan and social determinants of health
- Create "larger" door with more available funding through partnership



- Deepen partnership with strategic alignment
- Address critical service, safety net, and community needs, gaps and opportunities for scale to improve outcomes
- Greater accountability with meaningful, multiyear funding and capacity support

Community Grants

Funding Available \$425K each year

Single-Year - \$5k-\$15K

Health Impact Grants

Funding Available ~\$1.35 M each year

Three-Year* - \$20k+ per year

Application by *Invitation Only*

Existing programs with demonstrated capacity to influence outcomes and scale services to address critical needs

Demonstrate collaborative leadership to address critical needs

Strategic, ongoing partnership and communication with funders

2022 COMMUNITY GRANTS

Summary of Key Improvements:

- Single application and reporting process
- Increased availability of funds
- Grantees can apply and receive funding annually (vs. every other year)
- Increased opportunities for grantees outside of Santa Fe from counties in northern New Mexico
- An entry point for deeper relationships between grantee and multiple funders

2022 COMMUNITY GRANTS


Total Available Annually: \$425,000

Grant Size: \$5,000, \$10,000 or \$15,000, general operating support depending on your annual budget:

Annual budget:

- < \$150,000, you may apply for a \$5,000 grant;</p>
- Between \$150,000 and \$500,000, you may apply for a \$10,000 grant;
- >\$500,000, you may apply for a \$15,000 grant

Organizations invited to Health Impact Grant <u>cannot</u> apply to community grants



CHFA COMMUNITY GRANT FUNDING CRITERIA

- Programs that address community needs and opportunities aligned with the CHNA priorities
- Programs serving populations in the seven county geographic region
- Willingness to align programs with program partners and use collaborative approaches in addressing community needs
- Commitment to equity in target populations served, staff and board composition
- Demonstration of focus on results (including effective strategies contributing to priority population-level outcomes and tracking progress on performance measures)
- Organizational and financial stability
 - ✓ The applicant is a 501c3, or has a fiscal sponsor with a 501c3
 - ✓ The applicant has been in operation for three or more years (generally recommended)


WHAT WE DO NOT FUND

We do not make grants for the following:

- Religious purposes
- Capital campaigns or endowments
- Scholarships
- Individuals
- Private school tuition assistance

SFCF - GIVING TOGETHER

- Begun in 2010: goal is to expand SFCF's fundholders' ability to understand current needs among local nonprofits – and therefore increase their giving
- Catalogue of proposal summaries
- Fundholders have chance to consider proposals essentially unfiltered by SFCF
- Donor advisor fundholder giving has been typically more than SFCF's discretionary funding
- CHFA Joint Funding applicants will be part of SFCF Giving Together Catalog (Part of the Proposal)

- **❖ April 1** Release 2022 Request for Applications
- **❖ April 30** Application Submission Date
- ❖ May-June Review Process*
- **❖ June** Awards Announced
- **July** Grant Agreements signed and funds sent out
- Summer/Fall Post-award convenings

*Please note: Application statuses will appear in your portal to let you know what review stage your application is in from May – June with a formal award announcement in June.

HOW TO APPLY

April 1 – April 30, 2022: online proposals only

- 1. Anchorum St. Vincent will host the CHFA Community Grant Application using of the cloud-based grants management system, SurveyMonkey Apply
- 2. To our community nonprofit partners, you will need to register to access the portal.
- 3. To log in or register, please visit: https://anchorum.smapply.io/prog/community_health_funder_alliance_-community_grant/
- 4. Collaborators can be added so multiple team members can support applications/reporting.
- 5. Application can be saved and accessed later.
- Answer questions; If helpful, cut and paste questions from previously saved Word document.
- 7. Pay attention to character limits.
- 8. Upload attachments.
- 9. Submit.

2022-2023 Community Grant Cycle Now Open!

Community Grants are open, competitive grants, awarded annually to programs that address community needs and opportunities aligned with CHRISTUS St. Vincent's Community Health Needs Assessment. Community Grants provide single-year funding in the amount of \$5,000, \$10,000 or \$15,000, depending on the size of the organization's



ACCESSING THE GRANTEE PORTAL

SM Apply account already exists?

- When you register to enter a SurveyMonkey Apply site, an account gets created for you within the SM Apply database. Once registered within one site you will need to re-register using the same password and credentials as the existing account.
- If this is the case, then a message appears that "An account with this email already exists." You will then be prompted to:
 - · Register with a new account,
 - Reset your password, or
 - Complete the registration with that account.



What to Expect? Verify Charity Status

As an applicant, when you log into your application, you will be able to see the Verify Charity Status task within your application. Select "Start" to begin the task. You will be asked to verify:

• **501(c)3:** 9 digit - Employer Identification Number (EIN)

Once you have selected "Verify," SM Apply will automatically check your EIN against the IRS database in order to confirm charitable status.

NOTE: If your charity is not verified by SM Apply, please check to see that the number was entered correctly within the applicant task and that the number exists within the appropriate list.

What to Expect? The Application Form

Important notes for new applicants:

- Correct punctuation and capitalization, including the legal name of your organization
- Fiscally sponsored organizations
- Grant size
- Outcome Area
- Performance management
 - A resource page is hyperlinked
- Nonprofit disclosure statement and certification
 - A narrative explanation is required for a "No" response
 - A "yes" response to NM State tax filings and Secretary of State annual reporting will automate a request for a copy of your New Mexico Certificate of Good Standing or a screenprint/screenshot of the business search results from: https://portal.sos.state.nm.us/BFS/online/CorporationBusinessSearch

The form contains the following sections:

Your answers will populate our database records, so please use correct punctuation and capitalization (i.e., including proper legal name of your organization). All fields are required unless otherwise indicated.

Word/character limits: Word/character limitations on response fields HAVE NOT been added to this online form. Given the size and type of grant, we recommend limiting narrative responses to short descriptions wherever possible.
